Mr. A K Kharya - Chief Engineer (EMO), CWC & Member Secretary INCID



ABOUT INCID

Indian National Committee on Irrigation and Drainage (INCID) was established along with the International Commission on Irrigation & Drainage (ICID) on 24th June 1950 to cater to India's needs for improvements in irrigation & drainage, through closer & active interactions with ICID.

INCID functions as India's representative National Committee for the ICID.

The primary objectives of INCID includes stimulating and promoting the development and application of irrigation, drainage, river training, and flood control techniques within India while integrating the efforts of Central Government, State Governments, academic institutions, and private sector in the field of agriculture water management.

INCID is serving as an ideal platform to stimulate appropriate application of engineering, agriculture, economic, environmental, legal, and social science technology to improve irrigation, drainage, and flood control practices.

INCID works towards identifying the technology upgradation needs of country and suggest import of technology from appropriate countries / organizations.

INCID was re-constituted in August, 2019 by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India. INCID is headed by Chairman, Central Water Commission (CWC) and Chief Engineer (Environmental Management Organization), CWC is its Member-Secretary, and Remote Sensing Directorate, CWC serves as INCID Secretariat.

Stimulating & promoting development & application of irrigation, drainage, river training, & flood control techniques.

Integrating efforts of Central & State
Governments, Academia & private sector for
agriculture water management; and

Co-operating with ICID for distribution & interchange of information concerning irrigation, drainage, river training, & flood control between National Committees.

INCID SESSIONS

INCID has held two meetings after its reconstitution in 2019. The gist of the discussions held in these meetings is given below:

First Meeting of INCID - August 2020

- INCID highlighted the issue of wide gap between available technologies & the practices on ground.
- ICID &INCID provide an excellent platform to share and learn from each other at global level.
- Detailed discussion held on various topics including goals of INCID, ICID Road Map to Vision-2030, training programmes & initiatives for capacity development, ICID Awards and the gigantic task of the organization of 75th IEC and 25th Congress of ICID in India in 2023.

Second Meeting of INCID - July & October 2021

- Discussion was held on ICID's grand initiative on "World Register of Irrigation Projects"
- Deliberations held upon the action plan to take forward the Terms of Reference (ToRs) of INCID
- Committee agreed to create awareness among State Govts for sending nominations for ICID awards

OTHER ACTIVITIES

ICID Awards: INCID is actively involved in creating awareness regarding the various ICID Awards. INCID calls out the deserving nominations for the World Heritage Irrigation Structures from the States/UTs. The received nominations are examined and processed by INCID based on ground-truthing and the ICID guidelines.

Direct Membership of ICID: INCID examines and processes the cases for the Direct Membership of ICID received from Indian Individuals or Companies or Institutes.

Coordination with States and WALMI/IMTI(s): As the apex agency in the field on agricultural water management, INCID works at close coordination with the Indian States, WALMIs and IMTIs etc.

RECENT ACHIEVEMENTS

ICID World Heritage Irrigation Structures (WHIS) Awards

ICID awards the prestigious WHIS awards for Irrigation Structures that are more than 100 years old & are still functioning. It includes both old operational irrigation structures as well as those having archival value.

India received highest number of WHIS awards (**four**) in 2020 & 2021, along with 2 WHIS awards in 2018, (total 10 WHIS). Some of the WHIS structures from India are depicted below:

ICID WatSave Awards

ICID VISION


A water secure world free of poverty and hunger through sustainable rural development.

RECENT INITIATIVES

WALMI Meet - 2022

& Land Management Institutes (WALMIs) / Irrigation Management Training Institutes (IMTIs) were set up in 1980s to promote advancement and acquisition of scientific knowledge and to provide scope for capacity building of the various stakeholders in the sector.

The huge gap between the technological developments vis-a-vis its WALMIs/IMTIs application in water sector on one hand and need for behavioural similar Institutes with change in water conservation and utilization practices by the people at slightly large at other hand was realized by INCID and National Water nomenclature spread Academy (NWA), Pune. It was also felt that having a greater throughout collaboration and coherence in the activities of these institutes engaged country which takes in imparting water education will encourage synergetic outcomes.

NWA Pune & INCID jointly developed a Webinar Series, named "WALMI-Meet 2022", in collaboration with WALMIs/IMTIs to present their activities in respect of the issues, solutions, constraints etc. The webinar series was held from Feb, 2022 to July, 2022, in One Week - One institute mode, wherein presentations were made by the 14 WALMIs/IMTIs. This sharing of issues and constraints by the various institutes would pave way for critical restructuring & rejuvenating of these institutes.

It may be noted that there are 14 no of varying the training and up capacity development programmes for all stakeholders at the grassroot levels.

73rd Foundation Day Celebrations

INCID and ICID jointly celebrated their 73rd Foundation Day on 24th June 2022 at CWC, New Delhi. As part of the celebrations, a seminar on "Role of Modern Irrigation in Global Food Security" was organized. The invitations for the Foundation Day celebrations were extended to the various experts from State/UT Govts, Central Agencies/Departments including CGWB, UYRB, ICAR, NMCG, CWPRS Pune, NIH Roorkee, CSMRS, NWIC etc., ICID-member country Embassies and other international organizations working in the field of irrigation and drainage.

RECENT INITIATIVES

9th Micro - Irrigation Conference (2019)


ICID has been hosting the International Micro Irrigation Congress since 2005 with an objective of creating awareness among its members and irrigation community worldwide about latest developments in micro irrigation technology to enhance crop production. Since 2012, the event will be renamed as International Micro Irrigation Symposium.

The 9th International Micro Irrigation Conference was successfully held at Aurangabad, India from 16-18 January, 2019. The event was jointly organized by ICID, INCID, CWC and WAPCOS. The conference aims and plans to provide a global platform for professionals and exhibitors by showcasing knowledge and technologies from the world over and providing business opportunities to the water resources communities.

The theme of the conference "Micro Irrigation in Modern Agriculture" aimed to share experiences in the use of new technologies and best management practices in drip, micro-sprinkler and other localized irrigation systems with sub-themes focusing on:

- Design, Innovations, and New Techniques for increased Crop Productivity;
- Micro-irrigation funding and Government support;
- Micro Irrigation for 'Cluster Level Farming and Small farm holders'; and
- Operation & Maintenance Services & Capacity Development for the Micro-Irrigation Systems.





Register of World Irrigation & Drainage Structures

ICID has taken a visionary initiative to document the irrigation and drainage schemes at the global level to highlight the development of the irrigation infrastructure across the world. This Register of World Irrigation and Drainage Schemes will serve as a global repository of information for projects having the registered GCA of 5000 hectares or more. This exercise would help guide in the systematic management of irrigation and agricultural water.

Central Water Commission has prepared a Compendium on Irrigation Projects, which comprises of about 2000 projects. This list is being updated on regular basis and these projects are being integrated with ICID's web portal "World Register of Irrigation Projects" having registered GCA of 5000 hectares or above.

CURRENT INITIATIVES

Conclave on "Water Security of India"

As an outcome of the discussion held among CWC, ICID, INCID and NWDA, a Conclave on "Water Security of India" has been planned as a 1½ day Side Event on **1st – 2nd Nov, 2022** during the 7th India Water Week (IWW) (1st – 5th Nov, 2022), to be organized by INCID, CWC & ICID and Prof Asit Biswas, a renowned water expert as main speaker.

The Conclave is proposed to be held in the form of a dialogue to deliberate upon the water security of India with eminent persons and thought leaders in the area of water resources. In view of the multidimensionality of the issue of water security, a total of 13 potential topics have been identified for deliberating the water security aspects pertaining to the country.

It is envisaged to publish the proceedings of the dialogue in the form of an edited book to give a permanent nature to the thoughts expressed by various experts. Further, resource persons for the potential topics have been identified and they are expected to make presentation as well as write a chapter on their respective topic, with the perspective of water security of India.

National Certificate Course on Participatory Irrigation Management (NCCPIM)

NWA Pune & INCID have joined hands for to develop and launch an online National Certificate Course on Participatory Irrigation Management (NCCPIM). NCCPIM is aimed to fulfill the long-standing need for PIM literacy among farmers and government field functionaries engaged in implementing PIM through the formation and strengthening of water user associations.

The online course will be effected thorough NWA Pune in association with the Indian Network on Participatory Irrigation Management (IndiaNPIM). The design, preparation and delivery of the training modules has been undertaken by IndiaNPIM and the course including all the course material has been hosted on the Moodle LMS of NWA (www.nwapune.gov.in).

Demo course on NCCPIM in Hindi & English mediums separately have been conducted for farmers to check the veracity and responsiveness of the website. No issues have been reported by the farmers and 90% of the farmers were able to finish the complete course in 10 days without any hurdle. NWA Pune has also conducted demo courses on the portal to check the process of registration and the responsiveness of the portal.

INCID is having deliberations with the stakeholders including NWA Pune and IndiaNPIM to discuss the schedule, modalities and arrangement for the launch ceremony of the online course.
